Children can change their reading books daily. It is very important for the children to be reading at home in order to help them progress through the various different stages and improve their vocabulary, which in turn helps them in their writing. Please continue to encourage your child to apply their phonic knowledge and skills to decode words and encourage them to re- read books to build up their confidence in their reading abilities. Questioning your child on what they have read is equally important. Asking them to recall key events and define words will have a significant impact on their comprehension skills and will support their guided and independent reading provision at school.

We listen to your child read at least once a week so we ask that their reading diary is in every day. The children will be working hard at school on their fluency and comprehension. By reading regularly at home, the children also receive the support from you in order to further aid in their progress.

We are always looking for willing parent volunteers to come into school to listen to the children read. If you can help with this it would be greatly appreciated. Please see either one of us if you think you can help. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to approach either one of us.

Please ensure that your child has a warm coat, hat, scarf and gloves in school every day as the children go out to play no matter what the weather.
