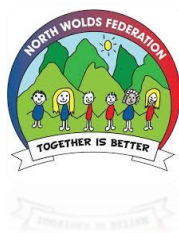

Welcome back to a new school year after a lovely summer holiday. The children have come back with a fantastic attitude to learn and have settled into our daily routines brilliantly! We have been working hard so far, and pupils have been demonstrating our school values in everything that they do, particularly by being respectful, kind to each other and co-operating with each other fantastically.

English

In English, we are already starting to enjoy our class text, 'The House with Chicken Legs' by Sophie Anderson, which is based on a Slavic folk-tale about Baba Yaga and her house that moves of its own accord! Our writing work will link to that text where appropriate, and will develop our knowledge of and skills in the following text types: stories from other cultures and traditions; narrative contemporary fiction; instructions; non-chronological reports; letters; and myths and legends. We look forward to seeing the pupils' creative skills in their writing flourish as we progress through the term.

We are also having a special focus on revising our knowledge of spelling rules and grammar structures. We will rehearse grammar points each day in our English lessons, and we use Active Spelling daily to practise spelling skills. As ever, presentation of work is very important, so we practise handwriting skills most days, too. Pupils are urged to focus on their presentation in all lessons, so that their work is always of a high quality.

Finally, we will continue with our daily Guided Reading sessions, which give the pupils the opportunity to be taught and to apply reading comprehension skills, including retrieval, inference, deduction and evaluation of text. Pupils will also work on an unseen text each week to apply their learning from the week and to enhance their knowledge of a range of texts.

Mathematics

In Mathematics, we will focus on ensuring that the children's knowledge of place value is secure, as this provides them with fundamental skills in number that will help with much of the work we do in the year. We will also be working on our skills of applying the four key mathematical operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and rehearsing the mental and written methods that go with each. Later in the term, we will develop our knowledge of fractions and decimals, for example looking at equivalent fractions, comparing fractions and starting to calculate with fractions.

We continue to enjoy our daily Flashback Four sessions: short, sharp daily practice of key arithmetic skills, facts and procedures, which will help the children to feel super confident with basic calculation strategies. We will also work daily on Rapid Recall facts – times tables in the first instance. We will continue to use Times Table Rock Stars to secure knowledge of multiplication facts for all tables up to 12x12, and we strongly encourage the children to practise these at home, as fluent recall of multiplication tables is essential to the maths pupils will study in years 5 and 6.

Science

Our topic this term is Evolution and Inheritance, in which we will develop our knowledge of how to classify organisms based on their characteristics. We will use comparative skills by looking at the similarities and differences of plants, animals and micro-organisms. Our scientific enquiry skills will focus on seeking patterns and conducting research using secondary sources.

R.E.

In RE, we will be focusing on 'How do people know who or what to believe? What do people believe about the existence of God?' We will be developing our reflection skills when considering questions about different sources of authority for people's beliefs and actions we will be providing reasons why some are trusted more than others. We will also be explaining how beliefs about the existence of God are open to interpretation.

Geography

In this subject we will undertake a virtual tour of Europe! We will develop our map skills to know and remember the names of the countries of Europe and their capitals. We will develop our knowledge of the human and physical geography of several European countries and develop the skill of comparison, identifying similarities and differences with Lincolnshire. By the end of this unit children will also know the locations and names of the major rivers and mountain ranges of Europe.

Jigsaw / PSHE

Jigsaw will provide the backbone of our Wellbeing and PSHE curriculum. We will be using analytical and evaluative skills in our theme of 'Being Me in My World.' Pupils will know about their place in different communities, from our school community to the wider role of being a citizen in our country today.

French

We will use Rigolo resources to rehearse speaking and listening skills, in order to know how to talk about ourselves, our families, and what we like to do. We also develop our knowledge of French language about school.

Computing

This term, we will learn about 'Communication and Collaboration'. The children will develop their knowledge of computer systems and how information is transferred between systems and devices. They will consider small-scale systems as well as large-scale systems. We will use comparison skills across different search engines, to discover how information is found on the World Wide Web. In the second half of the term, we will be learning about Programming in the Crumble environment – both the knowledge of how to program components, and the skills involved in programming a Crumble device.

P.E

In P.E., children will play Netball, in which they will learn the skills and techniques needed in the game, then apply them while gaining knowledge of its strategies and rules. Pupils in Years 5&6 will also enjoy Swimming lessons, where they can continue to work on their technique and stamina in our pool.

Design & Technology

In Design and Technology this term, we will use design skills to create our own moving houses, related to our English text 'The House with Chicken Legs'. We will understand how to use programmable technologies to assemble moving parts, then know how to construct them and make them work!

Pupils are also very fortunate to enjoy our Cooking in the Curriculum lessons, which form part of the Design and Technology curriculum. This term, pupils will use their developing cooking skills to make carrot and coriander soup - suitable for the time of year!

Important Information

As per the Federation homework policy, homework will be set on Friday and should be returned on Thursday. For homework, children will be given some spellings: please help your child to practise their spellings using the exciting tasks from our spelling task menu. Also, the children will be given some mathematics homework. This includes accessing Times Table Rock Stars and learning a set of mathematical facts that can be deployed across the Mathematics curriculum. Please contact me if there is ever a problem accessing Times Table Rock Stars.

Our P.E days are: Tuesday and Wednesday. Every other Tuesday until half term, starting Tuesday 15th September, we will be going for an extended swimming session at our sister site at Market Rasen. Wednesday PE will be led by JB Sports, our partner providers.

Please listen to your children read as regularly as you can. This reading can include stories and reference books, newspapers and sports reports, recipes and instructions, websites and magazines – anything where they are reading! Record your child's reading by signing their Reading Record Book: this will mean your child will be able to attend the exciting termly reading challenge reward.
