Dear Parents/Carers

A Gradual Return To Normality

Thank you for all of the support you have given us over the last year; it has been very much appreciated. Whilst the global pandemic has created many challenges and difficulties in school, there have been many positive outcomes. Some of these include, how amazingly the entire Nettleton Community has pulled together and the resilience shown by staff and children alike. We have also found new ways of working, some of which will benefit us once the pandemic is long forgotten.

We are working hard to get things as close to normal as possible, continue reading to find out how we intend to do this.

School Uniform

It is wonderful to see the vast majority of our children in full school uniform when it is not their PE day. We would like all children to wear full school uniform, including black school shoes. To this end, we will start to uphold our school uniform policy as it gives children an identity and belonging to our school. If your child is not able to wear full school uniform due to financial reasons please get in touch as we will be able to help you.

PE Kits

One of the unintended outcomes of the pandemic is that we realise how much better it is for children to come to school in their PE kits on PE days, we intend to continue this permanently. From September we are going to ask all children to come into school with a dark blue tracksuit (or dark blue jogging bottoms and sweatshirt top) for PE, please bear this in mind when you start shopping for next year's uniform. You can also pick these items up at a low cost from supermarkets and other clothing retailers like Primark, Matalan etc.

Attendance

Please support us by bringing your child to school every day unless they are unwell as school attendance is once again compulsory. Remember to call the office if your child is not going to be in and please keep your child off if they show any COVID19 symptoms and arrange a test.





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Clubs

We know how important extracurricular clubs are to the wider education of our children and how many children have missed not being able to take part.

From Term 5 we will be opening "Bubble Clubs" run by their class teacher. Children will be able to access their club in their own class bubble. This will enable us to restart clubs in a safe way.

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Swimming

We are awaiting guidance from the Lincolnshire Health Protection Team to give us the all clear to resume swimming lessons. As soon as we are able to we will restart this really important aspect of your child's education.

Homework

We will resume homework after the Easter holidays. Following the outcomes of a parental consultation we did pre-pandemic, we are running a pilot strategy for homework. The aims of the new strategy focus on the basics children need to succeed academically; specifically reading, phonics/spelling and mental fluency. We are also hoping that this will support families with busy lives who struggle to get homework done. We will seek your views on the new homework arrangement in the summer term.

Visits and Residential

At present we are not allowed to take children on educational or residential visits however we have plans to restart these as soon as the guidance allows. We are currently trying to organise the 2021/22 Years 5 & 6 residential (for children who are currently in Years 4 & 5) however there are issues regarding insurance to overcome before we can confirm. If you have a child in Years 4 or 5 please complete this FORM if you have not yet done so.

We have had some Year 6 parents ask us if their child will be able to go on a residential trip this year. Sadly it is highly unlikely as these events are usually booked two years in advance. If circumstances allow we will try to do something for our Year 6 children however we cannot make any promises at this point.

Parents Evening

As you will have noticed we were not able to hold our Term 3 parents evening. We intend to hold these in Term 5 either over the phone or via video conferencing. More details will come out in Term 5.

As you can see we are working hard to make school as normal as possible and give children the widest opportunity and experiences possible. Thanks once again for your support as we return to normal.

Finally, whilst we are very much looking towards a return to normal, infection rates in our area are still much higher than the national average and we all have our part to play to get this down. Please help us by continuing to follow our many systems of control which will keep our whole school community safer.
