Welcome back to school after the Easter holidays. We really hope that the children are looking forward to a whole term of in school learning!

English

In English, we are focussing on poetry, narratives, journalism and persuasion within our theme of mountains and volcanoes. We will also be looking at Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet later in the term. We have a new class text 'When The Mountains Roared' by Jess Butterworth, which will link life in the Indian mountains to our work.

We will continue with our spelling rules and grammar structure lessons

Our daily Guided Reading sessions will allow us to delve deeper into texts on a variety of subjects and expand the vocabulary of the children.

Mathematics

In Mathematics, we will be focussing on Properties of Shape, including Angles, then learning about Position and Direction in Geometry. This will be followed by consolidation of learning about the Four Operations and further consolidation of any other areas required. We will finish the academic year with a number of Maths investigations to hone our problem-solving and reasoning skills.

We will be continuing with our daily Flashback Four sessions: these include questions from across all Maths topics to help children stay fresh with their recall of Mathematical knowledge from fields such as Geometry and Measurement.

We will again be working daily on Rapid Recall facts, focussing on key Arithmetic skills. We will be continuing with our Times Table Rockstars weekly battles between classes and strongly encourage the children to play along with these at home.

R.E

In RE, we will be focusing on 'Life Journeys'. This will take in journeys across a range of religions.

Geography

We will be learning about the formation of volcanoes along with the effects of earthquakes and tsunamis. We will compare life on a volcanic island with our own country and county.

PSHE/Jigsaw

We have incorporated the 'Zones of Regulation' within each class. We have daily check-in sessions to allow the children to assess how they have felt during different periods of the day.

We will be working through two of our Jigsaw units. The forthcoming themes are 'Relationships' and 'Changing Me'. As always, these will be taught with sensitivity. If you have any concerns, please speak to the staff.

P.E

In PE, we will be focussing on cricket and athletics.

Design & Technology

In DT this term, we will be designing and making a model of a volcano. The model will involve a cam mechanism and programmable lights.

French

We will cover the units involving holidays and celebrations.

Music

We will be listening to 'Dancing in the Street' and 'You've Got a Friend in Me'. Our discussions will be based around song writing and structure.

Important Information

We are trialling a new homework policy. The homework will be set on Friday and returned on Thursday.

Our P.E days are: Tuesday and Wednesday.

Part of the new homework policy is for children to read to an adult at least four times a week. This reading could include newspapers, instructions, websites and magazines. Record your child's reading by signing their organiser. The children will be issued with Spelling as part of their homework; please ensure these spellings are practised and recorded on the sign-off sheet in their homework book.
