Infection Control Measures

We continue to strictly follow the DFE and Public Health guidance for COVID19 infection control measures. We hope that we will be able to remove some of the measures but can only do so when the guidance changes. You can help us by:

- Not sending your child to school if they have a high temperature, new cough or loss or change in smell or taste. If this is the case please arrange a PCR test; not a lateral flow test.
- Bringing your child to school as close to their bubble time as possible.
- Socially distancing from adults and other children when on site.
- Wearing a face covering on site if you are able to.
- Ensuring your child has washed their hands child's hands before they leave for school and upon arriving home.

I would like to thank you all for following the above over the past 16 months. The efforts have ensured our whole community is safer.

Sun Safety

With the nice weather comes the risk of sunburn. Please apply long lasting sun cream to your child before they come to school and send them in with a sun hat. If your child needs to apply sun cream in the day please be aware that staff cannot support children with this. Long lasting suncream, applied in the morning, is the preferred option.

Uniform
