Dear Parents / Carers

I hope that you are having a lovely summer holiday and have been enjoying opportunities to go out and about. This newsletter is to give you updated information regarding the school reopening on Monday 6th September 2021.

COVID 19 update:

Infection Control Measures

We continue to follow the DFE and Public Health guidance for COVID19 infection control measures. You can continue to help us by:

- Not sending your child to school if they have a high temperature, new cough or loss or change in smell or taste. If this is the case please arrange a PCR test; not a lateral flow test.
- Bringing your child to school as close to the start time as possible.
- Only one adult on site when dropping off or collecting children.
- Wearing a face covering on site if you choose to.
- Ensuring your child has washed their hands before they leave for school and upon arriving home.

We are no longer required to be in class 'bubbles' and the children will be able to mix with their year group peers at play and lunch times.

We will continue with the following system of controls:

1. **Ensure good hygiene for everyone.**
2. **Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.**
3. **Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.**
4. **Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.**

From 19th July, NHS Test and Trace have worked with the positive cases to identify close contacts. This is likely to be a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact. As parents or carers, you may be contacted to help with identifying close contacts.

Individuals **are not required to self-isolate** if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and **any of the following apply**:

- they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, NHS Test and Trace will inform affected individuals, children or their parents or carers that they have been in close contact with a positive case, and advise them to take a PCR test.

We would encourage everyone to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

The start of the school day will be 8.40am and school will finish at 3.00pm.

Teachers will be out on the playground from 8.30am if you need to speak to them when you drop off your child.
