Welcome back to the new school year! I hope you have enjoyed the Summer Holiday and that the children are ready to return to learning and developing their skills and knowledge.

During this Autumn Term, we will be learning about the Vikings and how their movement to Britain shaped our country. We have a number of activities planned to enhance their learning throughout the term including a visit to the Jorvik Centre and DIG in York.

Autumn Term 2019 Our theme is 'Here Come The Invaders'.

As part of our Exit day, we will create an exhibition on Viking life.

English

In English, we will have daily reading sessions. These aim to develop each child's ability to understand and discuss the language that they encounter. The children will work in smaller groups focusing on key skills across a range of texts. As a class, we will be reading Viking Boy, a tale of revenge and adventure. We will be using this text and Beowulf as our starting poins for a range of writing, particularly narrative pieces.

Our written work will continue to focus on developing sentence structure through grammatical skills. We aim for the children to write for longer periods and develop the characters, and descriptions, in their writing. Their vocabulary and writing skills will be helped by regular reading of high quality books. We hope they can access these in school, the library or from recommendations.

Spelling and handwriting continue to have great importance. The children will learn a spelling rule each week and practise this rule as part of their class work and homework. They will also learn a handful of words from the Y5 and Y6 list. All of these can be found in their new Reading Record.

Mathematics

In Maths this term, we will begin by exploring the place value of numbers. This includes Roman numerals, numbers up 10 million and rounding numbers to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand. We will then be developing the addition and subtraction skills along with multiplication and division methods. For these methods, it is vital that the children know their multiplication facts up to 12 x 12. We will continue to use Times Table Rockstars as homework. Hopefully we can win some of the class battles!

Later in the term, we will develop children's knowledge of the four operations – addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Science

Within science, we are learning about Living Things and Their Habitats. This will include how flowers are pollinated and how seeds, and fruits, are produced. We will then be looking at life cycles and how metamorphosis occurs in some animal life cycles. Finally, we will compare how different animals reproduce by laying eggs or giving birth.

History
In our history lessons, we will focus on events and life after the Romans left Britain up to the Norman
Invasion in 1066. We will learn about how the Vikings invaded, conquered and then integrated with
the people of Britain. We will look at their settlements, transport, food, crafts and lifestyle. This
knowledge will be built on an understanding of the key events and people of the times.
R.E
Our topic in RE this term is Being Human, with a focus on the religion of Islam. We will consider what the
Qur'an says about how Muslims should treat others and live their lives. This involves learning about the five
Pillars of Islam. The final pillar being the pilgrimage that some Muslims make to Mecca.
PSHE
In PSHE, we are learning about 'New Beginnings'. This topic focuses on pupils' new experiences and
how they can ensure they make the appropriate choices to make the best of new opportunities.
Art
In Art, we are going to be focussing our learning on drawing techniques in order to recreate different
art styles from Viking culture. In addition, we will be learning how Vikings constructed their
jewellery. We will also link the work of M.C. Escher to the patterns created by the Vikings.
Music
In Music, we will be gaining an understanding of how the pulse, pitch and rhythm of different pieces
of music affects the listener.
P.E
Our PE topics, this term, will be Swimming, Football, Rugby and OAA.
