## Headteacher's Newsletter

We are all very much looking forward to the run up to Christmas. This newsletter will give you some important information about this school term alongside some key dates for your diaries.

## **Anti Bullying Week**

This week is our anti bulling week where we ensure all children know what bullying is and what they should do if they think they, or a friend, is being bullied. The key message we give to children is the **STOP** message.

Several Times On Purpose	Our definition of bullying
Start Telling Other People	What to do if you feel you are being bullied.

This week children will:

- Have collective worships based around anti-bullying
- Have anti-bullying themed PSHE lessons. (For our older children this will be linked to the protected characteristics from the equality act)
- Wear odd socks to highlight the issue of bullying.
- Undertake our annual school safety survey where we ensure all children feel safe in school and can • identify who they would talk to in school if they had a concern. Outcomes of this are placed on our school website.
- Learn the **STOP** message.

Thankfully allegations of bullying are rare in our school. Any allegation or signs of bullying are taken very seriously and will be overseen by a senior member of staff.

### **BRAKE Road Safety Week**

In the W/B 18<sup>th</sup> November we will be highlighting road safety and teaching children how to keep themselves safe. Road deaths in West Lindsey are much higher than the national average so it is imperative that we keep our children safe. This is a key part of our context specific curriculum for the children in our setting.

### **Defeat The Sweet**

We continue to work hard to reduce sugar content in school to make our children as healthy as possible.

The principles of the Defeat the Sweet strategy are:

- We have a whole school food policy.
- Water and milk are the only permitted drinks.
- No food or drink rewards or treats offered.
- Our Federation kitchen limits sugar to 8g per dessert portion.
- We only allow fruit or vegetables at snack time.
- Sweets and chocolate are not allowed in packed lunches.
- We hold at least one assembly a year on healthy eating.
- In cooking lessons, we cook savoury dishes only.
- We provide information to children and families about healthy eating.
- We participate in National Smile Month.

You can help us "Defeat the Sweet" by only sending your child to school with water, only sending fruit or vegetables in for breaktime snacks and following the guidance for packed lunches that can be found in the <u>Packed Lunch and Breaktime Snack policy</u>. Many thanks for your support and help with this.

### **Enterprise Afternoon**

We are excited to hold an enterprise afternoon on the 10<sup>th</sup> of December 2024. The children will be making Christmas items that they think parents might like to buy. Any profits made will be spent on the children. It would be great if you could join us for this between 2.00-3.00pm. FOS will be serving refreshments once you have visited your child's class.
